

By the blessings of Lord Shiva and Guru Basava, it is my pleasure to serve our Veerashaiva-Lingayat community of North America as the first servant of this great religious non-profit organization, Veerashaiva Samaja of North America (VSNA). Our Samaja is built on the vision of "Samanvaya", passion, diligence and hard work of our past presidents, past board members and our life members since 44+ years.



Our team consists of passionate Chapter Presidents, Elected Board Members and Officers having high motivation to serve you all at 'All Chapters' level with strong collaboration as ONE TEAM to rejuvenate, build and expand our beloved and sacred VSNA. As your team of servants, with great pleasure, we are sharing our Vision and Goals for VSNA 2021-2022:

VISION

Preserve and strengthen the 40+ year old organization for the younger generation with vigor and vitality via growth and reform.

GOALS

Growth:

- Extricate our sacred organization from the legal involvement as early as possible.
- Engage members' participation across chapters with innovative community service and networking programs.
- Pursue consistent outreach program to build "Samanvaya" among our chapters and community-at-large to unify.
- Engage members by promoting All-Chapters virtual programs (key events and convention).
- Merge the distinction between Chapter and Central memberships along with increasing life memberships.

Reform:

- Build the collaborative culture by bringing end to legal activism witnessed in recent years.
- Engage younger generation in all aspects of the organizational structure to develop future leaders.
- Develop web-based online services for membership and chapters to improve digital experience.
- Enhance web based VIRC as online library for Veerashaiva-Lingayat related information.
- Develop policy and procedures for conducting VSNA business and processes in all aspects while following and adhering to our VSNA Bylaws.

After it was duly certified by the election committee, our team took the oath of allegiance to our Mission, Goals and to the Objective of Bylaws of VSNA on Feb 8th, 2021. In line with our Goals, within first fifty days, as one team, we are happy to share with the community: -

1. March 20th, 2021: More than sixteen chapters enthusiastically participated by sending their programs to our All Chapters Mahashivaratri, dedicated to Akkamahadevi, a virtual online program conducted for

- roughly three hours and viewed by nearly 900 families. Most notable presentation was, the video presentation by VSNA NextGen, our youth group.
- 2. March 20th, 2021: On the day of our Mahashivaratri event, we announced the continuation of our community building and outreach programs to engage all of you in International Basava Jayanti 2021 on May 15th, 2021 and started collaborating with Kannada Organizations in North America and Veerashiava-Lingayath organizations all around the world.
- 3. As promised in our vision and goals, we focused our effort to bring an end to the legal involvement of VSNA which had brought the organizational activities to stand still for the past nine months. On the first day of our service to VSNA, we received a court order to submit all the VSNA Bylaw 2020 voting process and membership details within 30 days (by March 10th 2021). As none of the data was available, we convinced eBallot organization (used by past president) to grant access to all the voting data and verified it against the payments received in VSNA checking accounts data. After detailed verification and analysis, shared all our findings with previous BOD and BOR along with current BOD and BOR. We received very minimal input to modify our data and formally submitted to the court. On March 25th, 2021, we received the judgment from Hon. Rae Lee Chabot, Circuit Court Judge, County of Oakland, State of Michigan, declaring VSNA Bylaws 2020 voting is invalid in its entirety (NULL & VOID). Hence, the legal case was formally closed and VSNA was extricated from its legal entanglement.
- 4. Excerpts from the Entered Declaratory Judgment issued on March 25th 2021:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECLARED, that the 2020 vote to amend the VSNA Corporate Bylaws is invalid in its entirety, without affect, and is hereby set aside.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECLARED, that there is evidence of fraud in the voting process by the "System Administrator", Srishail K. Hadimani, and improprieties in tabulating the vote.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECLARED, that the Plaintiff, GADIGEPPA DODDAMANI, prevailed and was successful in his challenge to the corporate

vote to amend the Bylaws.

THIS ORDER DISPOSES OF THE LAST PENDING CLAIM AND CLOSES THE CASE.

As per the mission and goals of VSNA and to be transparent with the general membership, we have provided the full transcript of Entered Declaratory Judgement from the court in our website, www.vsna.org/resources/

We earnestly look for guidance and blessings from all our Past Presidents, Past Board Members, Senior leaders, and best wishes from all of you to continue to work towards fulfilling and realizing our Vision and Goals.



According to VSNA Bylaws, the activities of VIRC shall include publications of quarterly newsletters and other publications. The VIRC shall serve as a real and virtual storehouse of all printed literature, disks (CDs and DVDs), paintings, artifacts etc. related to the Lingayat religion and history of Samaja.

I am pleased to report that Yashavanth Gaddi has accepted the Editorship of Samanvaya (Former name: Baandhavya), our quarterly newsletter. All the past newsletters are under Services on VSNA.org. Several other publications are also archived at the same site. Hope you can make use of these in enhancing your knowledge of our beloved religion and ways of life.



Vachana literature and articles on Veerashaiva and Lingayat principles are now extensively available online. VIRC will try to assemble the links to these and make them available on VSNA.org soon.

Our membership now consists of four generations of individuals. We must create programs to introduce our children to Vachanas along the lines of the 'VachanaVana' program of Southern California Chapter. The series of talks from this chapter on various aspects of Veerashivism (Shoonya Sampadane, Sharanaru Kanda Shiva) are in Kannada and are easily accessible to adults and seniors. We will list links for these programs on VSNA site so they can be used by all. Our youth and young adults (without exposure to Kannada) need programs and literature in English to convey the principles. We also need to create a structured program (along the model of Chinmaya Mission) to educate our membership. These are monumental tasks, and we need volunteers to contribute to these efforts.

Starting this month, VIRC will coordinate the **VSNA VICHARA VEDIKE (V3)**, a weekly online discussion on Veerashiva – Lingayat principles and practices. We would like these sessions to be focused on how the principles and practices are pertinent to us here today. We have several scholars in our community, and I am requesting them to volunteer to lead the weekly sessions. We will also invite Swamijis and Scholars from everywhere to lead these sessions. The success of V3 depends on your interest and feedback.

Please read the newsletter and make use of the books and articles available on VSNA site and let us know of your thoughts on enhancing their usefulness. Also, please provide us the details on other artifacts you have found useful.



Submissions may include the life of Sharanas, Vachana interpretations and the philosophy. Please share contributions / achievements of the members in enriching the community around the world.

- 1. Articles should be original in nature and have not been published in any other format / heading in the previous editions of Baandhavya or any other VSNA publications.
- 2. If the articles contained any part or paragraph of previously published books / articles, appropriate reference should be provided.
- 3. Articles should be 1-2 pages (exceptions can be made up to 4 pages based on the subject / topic).
- 4. Up to 2 articles per author / issue will be considered per publication
- 5. Editorial committee will review the article within 5 business days and the editor-in-chief will communicate to the writer of its acceptance / revision /rejection.
- 6. Revised article will be considered as a new submission and due course will be followed.
- 7. Articles received within the prescribed due date will be considered for publication in the issue. If an article is received after the due date, it will be considered for the following issue.





Does Veerashaivism Fill Our Religious Needs in Today's world?

Man's search for the meaning of life is as old as man himself. Anytime we have a moment to ourselves, the first question that comes to mind is: Why am I here, and what am I supposed to be doing? The question is not merely what do I want to do, but what should I do with it? The dilemma is not a practical one but a moral one. Throughout human history, from the ancient Hindus and Greeks to the most modern societies, man has recognized the twin forces of science and religion. Science deals with our external world and material progress while religion helps us to deal with our internal world, those nagging questions that spring from that corner of the soul. Science tells us how things work and makes our daily living easy while religion helps us to make sense of our day-to-day lives. As humans, we crave for more than just the outside world, no matter what it is. It is the religion that provides the blueprint for man's spiritual growth and survival. Some scholars refer to this aspect of our duality as logos and mythos — the two Latin words Logos is logic, reason, and science, while mythos is faith and religion. Both are essential and complementary to our total well-being and experience as humans. From time to time, whenever science and reason have made quantum leaps, the role of religion in human affairs has been challenged. One such example took place during the 'Age of Reason' in eighteenth-century Europe. Advances in science convinced man that all nature could be reduced to a series of mathematical laws and the workings of the universe were seen to be orderly and simple. If the same rigor of reason could be applied to all other matters just as well, humankind's happiness would be assured. The reason, if followed logically as in the natural sciences, would replace tradition and faith. That was three hundred years ago and we know better, man's need for religion has never been greater. Science has marched on at an unprecedented pace since then and how little we know of our inner selves and how empty and isolated we feel. Some refer to it as being in a condition of permanent limbo and longing. Religion has filled this gap through the ages and continued to do so to this day. Religion's role has varied in relation to science and politics of the

day, but it has never been eliminated. Religion has stood the test of time and will always be with us. Most of human life is about hopes and fears, which are outside the realm of reason and it is the religion that helps us manage them in a way that we can accept the outcomes. Religion serves as a bridge from the known to the unknown and provides us comfort and peace. Religion teaches us charity towards all and malice towards none. It is the power to guide and guard our steps so that we may choose the right from the wrong and the good from the bad. It is obvious then that we need religion in our life to give us completeness and peace of mind. The next two sections examine two views on religion followed by a discussion of why religion ends up as a ritual. The last section discusses the applicability of Veerashivism to our life today. Rabindra Nath Tagore, the poet laureate of 20th century. India, provides an interesting view of religion. If we want to light a lamp in a room, a lot of preparation is needed. We will have to depend on many people: lamp makers, sellers, and so on and so forth. Even with all the preparation and effort, the light that we get out of the candle is very little. It may satisfy the need to light the room but it makes the darkness outside even more than before. On the other hand, we do not have to depend on anyone to receive the light from the morning sky. We do not need to create anything. We just need to be awake and open our eyes. No one can resist the flood of light from the sky filling every corner of the world. Religion is similar to this light. Religion is as simple, infinite, and abundant as the light from the sky. It is the gift of God. It is eternal and all-pervading. It has silently engulfed humanity from all around. All that we need is a desire to receive it. We need only to open us hearts. The key moral of the religion must be very simple and fulfilling. But we have made our religion the most complex aspect of our life through artificial rituals, complex theories, and diverse imaginations. We are constantly creating new factions and groups to get out of our self-imposed complexities. These factions and groups teach us humility and belief in the grace of God. In its truest form, religion gives are always in conflict with each

other creating unhappiness, war, and destruction. We have not been completely faithful to Religion. Instead, we have tried to make Religion suitable to our imagination. We have adapted Religion to suit our day-to-day needs like all other material necessities of our life. There is no doubt that religion is the most important need of our life. We reduce its importance by making it fit our needs. Religion is beyond everything that we can conceive with our feeble mind. It gives us constant support because it is eternal. There is no need to adopt a Religion. God is not what we comprehend. What we understand is not the Religion that is our world. It has all the symptoms of the world. The symptoms of the world are diversity and conflict. We are satisfied when we understand something. But what we understand keeps changing. We want to understand everything in search of happiness. But our happiness ends as soon as we understand. As Upanishad says "What is unlimited is happiness; there is no happiness to which that is limited". If we try to comprehend the unlimited with our limited perception, it will create unhappiness. Therefore we must try to realize the unlimited by detaching ourselves from the world. We will never be able to achieve it by applying material laws. The simple moral of Religion did exist in Upanishad. Brahma's manifestation in Upanishad is very complete. He is Truth; otherwise, nothing would have been true in the universe. He is the Knowledge. All Knowledge that exists is His knowledge. He is limitless. The world is a manifestation of Brahma's limitless Knowledge and Truth. Upanishad has never tried to establish any particular deity or temple in any particular place. It teaches us to focus, only to feel the presence of Brahma in everything around us by eliminating all complexities of diverse and restless imagination. Swami Vivekananda, the famous Hindu ascetic, thrilled the Western World with his eloquent exposition on Vedanta philosophy and religion in the Parliament of Religions held in Chicago in 1894. In his lectures in London that year, he provided an interesting definition of Religion. According to him, of all the forces that have worked and are still working to mold the destinies of the human race, none certainly is more potent than religion. It is obvious that in very many cases the bonds of religion have proved stronger than the bonds of race, climate, or even descent. It is a well-known fact that persons worshipping the same God, believing in the same religion, have stood by each other, with much greater strength

and constancy, than people of merely the same descent. Various attempts have been made to trace the beginnings of religion. In all the ancient religions which have come down to us, we find one claim made that they are all super-natural, that their genesis is not in the human brain, but that they have originated somewhere outside of it. Two theories have gained some acceptance amongst modern scholars. One is the Spirit Theory of Religion, and the other is the Evolution of the *Infinite*. The first maintains that ancestor-worship is the beginning of religious ideas, the other that, religion originates in the personification of the powers of nature. Man wants to keep up with the memory of his dead relatives, and thinks they are living even when the body is dissolved, and he wants to place food for them and, in a certain sense, to worship them. Studying the ancient religions of the Egyptians, Babylonians, Chinese, and many other races in America and elsewhere, we find very clear traces of this ancestor-worship being the beginning of religion. With the ancient Egyptians, the first idea of the soul was that of a 'double'. Every human body contained in it another being very similar to it, and when a man died this 'double' went out of the body and yet lived on somewhere and somehow. But the life of the 'double' lasted only so long as the dead body remained intact, and that is why we find among the Egyptians so much solicitude to keep the body uninjured. And that is why they built those huge pyramids in which they preserved the bodies. For, if any portion of the external body was hurt, the 'double' would be correspondingly injured. This is ancestor-worship. The scholars from the ancient Aryan literature show that religion originated in nature-worship. Although in India we find proofs of ancestor-worship everywhere, yet in the oldest records there is no trace of it whatsoever. In the Rig Veda Samhita, the most ancient record of the Aryan race, we do not find any trace of it. Modern scholars think it is the worship of nature that they find there. The human mind seems to struggle to get a peep behind the scenes. The dawn, the evening, the hurricane, the stupendous and gigantic forces of nature have exercised the human mind, and it aspires to go beyond, to understand something about them. In the struggle they endow these phenomena with personal attributes, giving them souls and bodies, sometimes beautiful, sometimes transcendent. Every attempt ends with these phenomena

becoming abstractions whether personified or not. Thus, a very strong case has been made out, that religion has its origin in the personification of the powers of nature. These two views, though seem to be contradictory, can be reconciled on a third basis which is the real germ of religion. This is, the struggle to transcend the limitations of the senses. Either, a man goes to seek for the spirits of his ancestors, or the spirits of the dead, or he wants to get a glimpse of what there is after the body is dissolved, or he desires to understand the power working behind the stupendous phenomena of nature. Whichever of these is the case, one thing is certain, that he tries to transcend the limitations of the sense and to find answers to the questions raised at the outset of this inquiry. In all organized religions, their founders, prophets, and messengers are declared to have gone into states of mind, that were neither waking nor sleeping, in which they came face to face with a new series of facts, relating to what is called the spiritual kingdom. They realized things much more intensely than we realized facts around us. Take, for instance, the religions of the Brahmins. The Vedas are said to be written by Rishis. These Rishis were sages who had realized certain facts. The exact definition of the Sanskrit word Rishi is a Seer of Mantras, of the thoughts, conveyed in the Vedic Hymns. These men declared that they had realized certain facts, and these facts they proceeded to record. Buddha sitting under the Bartee reached that superconscious state of mind. All his teachings came through this, and not through intellectual cogitation. Thus, a tremendous statement is made by all religions, that the human mind, at certain occasions transcends not only the limitations of the senses but also the power of reasoning. It then comes face to face with things that it could never have sensed, could never have reasoned out. These facts are the basis of all religions of the world. Of course, we have the right to challenge these facts, to put them to the test of reason, nevertheless, all the existing religions of the world claim for the human mind this peculiar power of transcending the limits of the senses, and the limits of reason; and this power they put forward as a statement of fact. Apart from the consideration of the question of how far these facts claimed by religions are true, we find one characteristic common to them all. They are all abstractions as contrasted with the concrete

discoveries of physics, for instance; And in all the highly organized religions they take the purest form of Unit Abstraction, either in the form of an Abstracted Presence, as an Omnipresent Being, as an Abstract Personality called God, as a Moral Law, or, in the form of an Abstract Essence underlying existence. In modern times, too, the attempts made to preach religions without appealing to the super sensuous state of the mind, have had to take up the old abstractions of the Ancients, and give different names to them, as "Moral Law", the "Ideal Unity", and so forth, thus, showing that these abstractions are not in the senses.

Religion and Rituals

As Tagore has said, there has always been a tendency to adopt religion to suit our daily lives. If we accept that the religion originated as either ancestor worship or nature-worship, a visualization of the power being worshipped helps focus on that worship. The various forms of this power in terms of idols or aids for worship have been adopted by all religions of the world. Along with the invention of idols, it has become natural to devise rituals to allow everyone to worship these idols. As the days go by, the meanings behind the idols and the rituals have vanished and a mechanical following has evolved. In every religion, when the influence of rituals overrides the meaning of power behind them, a reformer has arrived to bring the meanings back. The followers of such a reformer end up creating an offshoot of the original religion which stays at the intellectual level for a while and becomes ritualistic eventually. This cycle of reformation and ritualization continue resulting in a multitude of gods and beliefs and rituals. One cannot say that being ritualistic is sub-human. Rituals alone might satisfy the religious needs of most individuals. Look at the faces of individuals in the bhajan group singing the prayers in any temple or religious gathering. You will see peace and oneness with God (with no awareness of the material world). Some can go into this transient state just observing a priest perform an elaborate pooja of the deities. For some, the ritualistic mode of being one with God may not be adequate. The four forms of Yoga prescribed for Hindus might be an attempt to satisfy individuals of varying nature: Karma Yoga (based on performing the daily chores to offer them to God); Bhakti Yoga (Devotion, Bhajans, chanting as ways of reaching

the almighty); Jnana Yoga (probing to understand God by contemplating his powers and learning more about why it is so) and Raja Yoga (the supreme form of all the four types, where one denies that "I" does not exist and one is part of God). Veerashivism became popular in the twelfth century AD through the teachings of Lord Basaveswara and other Sharanas as an attempt to reform the society when religion and rituals were taking over the simple rules of humanity and equality among individuals. The main premise of Veerashivism is equity, justice, and equality, service with sacrifice, tolerance, and emphasis on humanism. It does not prescribe a place of worship, but advocates that one is aware of God's presence in everything and everywhere. There are three aspects of Veerashivism that are pertinent to our examination of its practicality to our lives in the modern world. They are the Five Codes of Conduct (Panchachara). The Sixfold Path (Shatsthala), and The Eight Aids (Ashtavarana). The Five Codes of Conduct are considered to be the life-breath of the seeker of God. They are:

- 1. *Lingachara*, which prescribes consistent monotheism. It calls for a strict belief in one God represented by Ishtalinga.
- 2. Sadachara, which implies earning one's livelihood through pure and honest work and sharing a part of the earning for the welfare of society (Dasoha).
- 3. *Ganachara*, which prescribes courage to fight social evils and injustice.
- 4. *Shivachara*, which implies the presence of God in each being thus portraying social equality and nondiscrimination.
- 5. Brityachara, which is the practice of humility. Basaveswara says "No one is smaller than me, there is no one greater than a true devotee". The Sixfold Path to reach God is very similar to the four Yogas mentioned earlier. The six progressive stages in which one seeks to be one with God are:
- 1. *Bhakti Sthala* the stage of intense devotion and faith.
- 2. *Maheswara Sthala* the stage of strong will and discipline.
- 3. Prasadi Sthala the stage of all grace.
- 4. *Pranarlinga Sthala* the stage of awareness of the Ultimate Reality (God) in life-breath.

- 5. Sharan Sthala the stage of total surrender to God.
- 6. Aikya Sthala the stage of sublime union with God

The Eight Aids that guide the seeker in his path to reaching God are:

- 1. *Guru*, a teacher who imparts knowledge about the universal soul and Initiates one into Veerashivism.
- 2. *Linga*, the icon of Veerashivism implying monotheism, non-idol worship, aid for meditation and contemplation.
- 3. *Jangama*, a wandering spiritual teacher who invokes faith and devotion in the seeker.
- 4. Vibhuti, the sacred ash worn on the forehead, arms, and neck indicating that the seeker has reduced the negatives like lust, anger, greed, and envy to ashes.
- 5. Padodaka, the literal meaning is the water used to wash the feet of the Guru; implies that the seeker develops qualities such as humility and equality and washes away his ignorance.
- 6. *Prasada* indicates the acceptance of food by the seeker for is won and sharing with the society.
- 7. Rudrakshi, means 'The eye of Shiva', the sacred beads worn on the body indicating that the seeker has opened his spiritual eye to look within, to realize God within.
- 8. Mantra, a set of words that allow the seeker to achieve quietness and introspection when chanted repeatedly. The common Mantra for Veerashaivas has been "Om Namah Shivaya" salutations to Shiva, these aids are meant to nurture the faith of the seeker in achieving the ultimate purpose of life. They are not meant to be an end to themselves. As we can see the Pancharas acceptable equally well to modern society no matter which religion one follows. The Shatsthalas prescribe a progressive way of life starting from the true worldliness ending in Godliness. The Ashtavaranas may be considered rituals and may not be completely applicable when taken literally. If one concentrates on their symbolism rather than the literal representation. they are guite practical even for this modern age. No wonder Veerashivism has been called Vishwa Manava Dharma (a religion that is applicable to the whole human world of all ages).

Mahashivaratri Festival Celebration





Collectively more than forty vachanas were recited. Members showcased their talents in various forms



Speaker Series on "Shoonya Sampadane"

"Shoonya Sampadane" is a seminal work of Kannada literature dating back to the 14th Century. One of its kind works is a compilation of the vachanas written by 12th Century Shiva Sharanas, expounding the philosophy of "Shivaadwaita" or the oneness with Shiva as envisioned by Sharanas such as Allama Prabhu, Basaveshwara, Akka Mahadevi, Siddharama, Chennabasavanna and several others.

The central figure of Shoonya Sampadane is Allama Prabhu. The vachanas have been beautifully arranged as if they were narrated conversationally between the characters and therefore adds a uniqueness to the style and approach taken in compiling them together.

In totality, they paint a splendid picture of the philosophical outlook, spiritual struggles in the Sadhana and the eventual epoch that was achieved by the Shiva Sharanas.

Our Guest Speaker **Shri. Praveen Shivashankar** did a tremendous job in explaining the intricacies of the deep subject in a digestible form to our members. In this series we touched upon the history of Shoonya Sampadane Sahitya, Veerashaiva Siddhanta, Prabhudevara Purva Sangatya, and Muktayakkana Sampadane, Shri Siddarameshwara Sampadane, Basavanna & Channabasavanna Sampadane, Arrival of Prabhudevaru and Siddharama's to Kalyana and Prabhudevara Aarogane. More than 600 selected Vachanas have been discussed during the last 38 sessions. Each session spanned for about 90 minutes to 120 minutes. In this quarter, the discourse covered. The series concluded on January 30, 2021 and members can watch the entire series on YouTube.


Speaker Series on "Sharanaru Kanda Shiva"





Veerashaiva Gurukul

Just like all the other chapters, GA chapter has been meeting monthly and conducting prayers. We realized that the time available in monthly meetings was very limited to teach our kids about our dharma. We felt we needed to invest additional time with kids on a weekly basis to inculcate Shiva Bhakti, teach them Shiva Puja, uniqueness of our traditions, imbibe Veerashaiva principles, philosophy, history and vachana saahitya so that they can lead a dharmic way of life and inherit our traditional values.

Beginning January 2020, we started Veerashaiva Gurukul classes every Sunday from 11:00 AM to 1 PM ET. While we met in-person for the first couple of months, the pandemic impacted us and we had to switch over to online learning. Frankly speaking remote learning has worked out better, as it cut down the commute time for kids and allowed participation from multiple regions. Today we have kids joining from Georgia, Virginia, North Carolina and India. We started with just a handful of kids to begin with and have been growing steadily ever since.

Here is the format we follow

- 1. Istha Linga pooja with step-by-step procedure (only when we meet in-person)
- 2. Learn dharmic concepts with focus on Shiva Bhakti, Veerashaiva Siddhanta
- 3. Learn to sing Vachanas after understanding the in depth meaning of each one
- 4. Kids exhibit their learnings by taking quizzes, tests, writing essays, stories, preparing presentations etc.

Our curriculum includes teaching general dharmic concepts that form foundations to understanding Veerashaivam, deeper level discussions of our Veerashaiva Lingayatha faith, learning shlokas that inculcate shiva bhakti in our life, stories around Shiva, Pramathas/Shiva Sharanas from Basava Purana and Shivamahapurana, learning to sing vachanas and shiva stotras etc.

These classes have been spectacular in how much kids are learning on a week-to-week basis. Gurukula kids are ready with topics to talk about anytime, know many shlokas and mantras by heart, sing and explain the vachanas they have learnt with clear pronunciation and utmost confidence. As a positive side effect of this learning, the kids are prepared to perform or demonstrate at events with a short notice, as opposed to the struggles we faced in the past to coordinate and prepare for events.

We believe in learning through discussions with the kids rather than teaching. All our study material is available online on a google drive. Most of our material is in the form of multimedia presentations. We are also proud that the kids volunteer with innovative ideas to keep the classes engaging and interesting. As an example, at the end of each learning, a kid volunteers to prepare a kahoot quiz for the topic and runs the quiz program for the rest of the group. Kids conduct competitions among themselves and cherish their learnings. There are healthy debates during these sessions which have helped even shy kids to open up. We are also trying to engage high school kids as volunteers for material preparation, coaching the younger ones, reviewing the work, reviewing the writing skills etc. We are trying to inculcate mentor-mentee relationships among our veerashaiva kids through this process.

We strive to connect the dots and draw attention to how our age-old philosophy is still more relevant than ever in the current day and age. We help them understand how they can apply what they learn in Gurukul in their daily lives here in the US, which is a totally different environment than how we grew up over in India. Volunteers:

- Dhanvin Yajaman (Youth Volunteer Mentor for kids, reviews the work, prepares materials)
- Harsha R Gurumurthaiah (Teaches Ishta linga puja)
- Roopa Jayadev (Singer teaches vachanas and bhajans)
- Veerabhadrappa Muchandi (Coordinator shares Shiva Bhakti)


















Dasoha:

In the absence of monthly VSNA face to face meetings due to pandemic and social distancing, GA chapter took up the service project in order to make a small difference in the local community we live in.

As GA VSNA community, we picked Food4Lives organization to extend our support to (https://food4lives.org/) About 40 million people face hunger in the U.S today - including more than 12 million children and more than five million seniors. The world is hungry, but the emptiness goes far beyond the table. Food4Lives strives to fight against homelessness and the underfed.

Our chapter not only chose to make a monetary donation of \$1000 towards this organization, but we also took up organizing the lunch service every few 3rd Sundays of the month. Once the covid situation improves, we are planning to get the youth/kids to lead

and take care of the entire service by collecting and organizing the donated items, pack and distribute the food cooked by the volunteers. It has been a very fulfilling experience to be able to do our part to help the needy during these difficult times. We believe there is no better way to reemphasize that Kayaka and Dasoha are truly the pillars of our value system.

event. The complete list of sponsors and volunteers is given at the end of this message. (Please accept our sincere apologies if we have inadvertently missed anybody.)


